THE TRANSITIONAL AGE YOUTH (TAY) SUMMER PROGRAM



Hope

Today

When are you going to get yourself a job? A typical question posed by most parents of adolescents and/or young adults. The Transitional Age Youth (TAY) summer program at Community Living Fort Erie offers a supported employment summer program, addressing pre-employment training and employment opportunities that meet the needs of youth between the ages of 14 and 24 with intellectual disabilities.

Those who show interest in the program and are committed to its objectives, receive pre-employment training so as to become job-ready applicants. In conjunction, the program links TAY participants with inclusive volunteer experiences, work-training, and/or competitive wage employment positions within the local community with the primary aim of full integration with minimal support. Through the development of TAY plans this aim is achieved, and each participant is matched to a placement opportunity based on their unique goals and interests.

This year the TAY program numbers were impressive! Overall, 21 TAY Giving participants were involved in the program. Seven TAY participants obtained paid employment, 12 TAY participants received volunteer or work-training positions, and 2 TAY participants solely dedicated their time to pre-employment training. Thus, 90% of participants acquired workrelated experience, and of this 90%, 30% of TAY participants successfully landed a job! These opportunities would not have been available without our community partners and local employers and we thank you for being part of a TAY participants journey into adulthood!

Inclusive Summer Camps



Everyone Benefits From Inclusion!!

For the 2017 summer we were able to offer camp opportunities to 25 children with varying abilities. The summer camp was made possible through several grants we received from HRSDC Canada Summer Jobs, Grants Ontario Summer Experience Program and The Niagara Community. We provided support to children at CAN-ter, Boys and Girls Club of Fort Erie, the Fort Erie YMCA and Heartland Forest. We employed nine full time staff at the 2017 Inclusive Camp Program.

Heartland Forest was new to some of the families this year. Heartland received funding through the NPI grant, which allowed our families to have the opportunity to receive free transportation to and from camp. This opportunity allowed campers to attend Heartland Forest for the first time. The young participants explored the outdoors; participated in new adventures, learned about how to care for our forests and respect nature, as well as participating in tie dying and making salsa. Stephanie, one of our camp counselors, who was new to us, developed a long lasting bond with this particular camper. She is currently enrolled in the EASNS program with Niagara College and hopes to pursue a career in the field of disabilities.

Campers at the Boys and Girls Club in Fort Erie, participated in weekly trips. A trip that all camp participants enjoyed was an excursion to the Shaw Festival Theatre, where they watched the play "Wilde Tails" and received a behind the scenes tour about how they construct the plays. One of our campers developed a keen interest in the backstage process where the costume designer used him for costume demonstration. Now this camper and his family are looking to attend Drama camp next year. Another trip that was a favorite amongst the participants was the weekly trips to the Kinsman Pool.

Campers participated in 'Swim to Survive' trainings where they did swimming lesson activities, developed swimming skills learned about water safety. The campers were able to play and enjoy the water with their peers in a fully inclusive environment.

Providing support to campers through the summer takes a great deal of commitment from the families, program counselors and inclusion facilitators, Community Living and along with the camp providers. We worked together to develop programming, modifications and inclusion for our young friends to have a fun and enjoyable summer experience filled with learning and laughter.

In the upcoming year we are committed to developing new camp opportunities that relate to camper interests. With the new minimum wage increase we will all need to work together to ensure campers will have opportunity to attend camps that are within their budgets and meet the needs of families. We will strive to be more creative in how we implement camp programming and support so that all children will have the chance to explore camp next summer.
