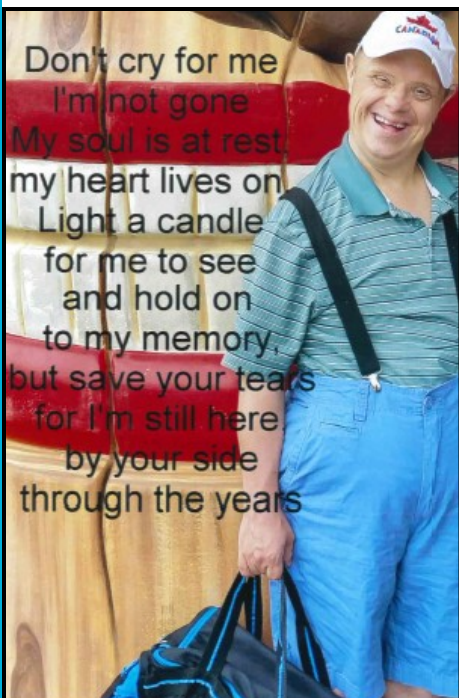

Funds raised at this event will be combined with our "Christmas In Mexico" Fundraiser to help with the purchase of a wheelchair accessible van!!

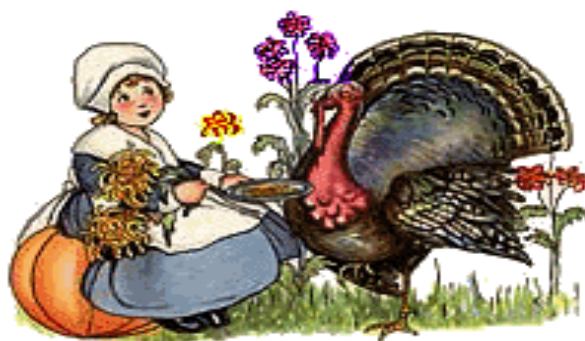

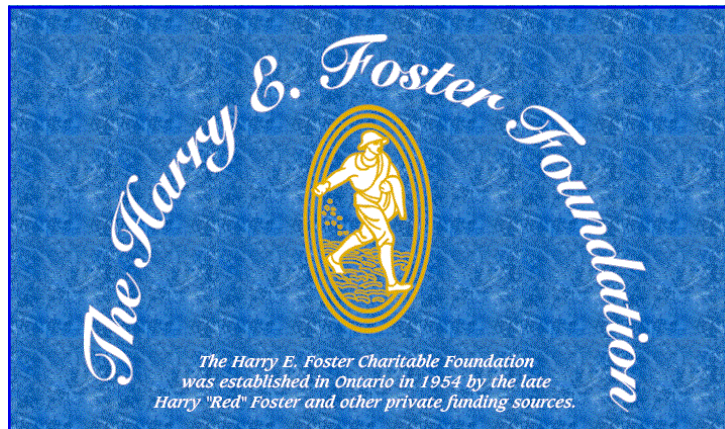

**...a total of \$30,240.00 in grants were received to fund
Community Living~Fort Erie 2016 Summer Programs**

A grant of \$10,000.00 from the Harry E. Foster Foundation allowed Community Living~Fort Erie to hire a TAY Coordinator and a TAY Facilitator for the summer.

Due to the generosity of the Harry Foster Foundation we were able to run our Transitional Aged Youth (TAY) Project this year. Without their support this project would not have been available to youth in our community with intellectual challenges.



Employment and Social Development Canada

Human Resources Services Development Canada funded four positions this year with a grant approval of \$14,240.00.

We were able to hire one Transitional Aged Youth Facilitator, an Inclusive Camp Coordinator and two inclusive camp facilitators with the funds provided. This funding ensured that children with intellectual challenges were included in existing camp programs in their community with their peers!

A grant was received from Niagara Community Foundation to support our 2016 Summer Inclusive Camp Program \$1,500.00 was received to provide one on one support to a child in the program. The Niagara Community Foundation also funded \$500.00 to purchase two laptops for the TAY Program through a Mini Grant.



Ontario

The Summer Experience Program granted \$2,875.00 to our organization to fund a Summer Camp Inclusion Facilitator for the 2016 Program.

A new Ministry of Training, Colleges & University grant was received for \$1,125.00 to subsidize a Summer Inclusion Camp Facilitator.

We have been fortunate to be able to have two teams who will be representing Community Living~Fort Erie in TWO Build Day projects. One will be held on October 3rd build team included Simon Reeves, Michelle Dellaventura, Andria Willick, Chris Wolfe, Jeremy Charron, April McCreary & Amy Mallette. The other build day will be November 23rd. We are very excited to be able to give back to our community in such a wonderful way!

This house will become a new home to a local family, Carlos, Rocio and their five children, who emigrated from El Salvador to Canada in 2011. The family found it difficult to leave their home country of El Salvador, but when their family was threatened by gang violence, they knew they

needed to leave to protect their children.

Many local businesses and community groups have signed up to participate to help build the house through Habitat's Adopt a Day sponsorship program. The program allows 6 - 8 volunteers the opportunity to work on the build site for a day as a fun and interactive way to give back. A combination of volunteer hours and financial contributions double the group's impact.

Whether or not individuals have ever swung a hammer or are already skilled in the construction field, they can all be part of Habitat's Adopt a Build Day program. Simon Reeves will be heading the volunteer teams on behalf of our organization!!

TAY Summer Program

(THE TRANSITIONAL AGE YOUTH SUMMER PROGRAM)

This is the second year that we have been able to offer the Transitional Age Youth Summer Program thanks to The Harry Foster Foundation Grant and the Employment and Social Development Canada Grant. These grants allowed us to hire 3 summer staff, a coordinator and two facilitators.



This program is offered to youth who are between the ages of 14-21. Participants receive pre-employment training, certificate opportunities and paid and volunteer placements that match their individual goals and interests.

This year we had 20 TAY participants and 20% of those people successfully found minimum wage summer job placements, 95% received volunteer experiences within the community and 100% completed employment training/certificates in either WHMIS, First Aid, Food Safety Handling, Smoke Free Ontario Act, 4 Steps Safety, Transit training and interview training.

Several of these placements have been taken over through the schools coop's program as they are in line with the persons TAY Plan and are relevant to their interests and goals.
