PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ANNUAL REPORT 2019



As we reflect on the 2018 – 2019 fiscal year we are happy to report that it was a very successful year. Our main funder, the then Ministry of Community and Social Services (MCSS), provided an additional \$275,926 to provide us with increased financial support in order to ensure that we are able to continue to deliver high quality services. We were fortunate to have this one time additional funding to address much needed repairs, maintenance and equipment needs, to address compensation issues and assist with underfunded benefits. We appreciate the ongoing funding provided by the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services (MCCSS) that allows us to provide a wide range of support services to children, adults and their families in Fort Erie.

This past year we also had significant, and much appreciated support, for our organization from many community partners, funders, individual supporters and community minded business owners listed in the program.

Our Annual Fundraiser, "A Mardi Gras Christmas" raised over \$36,000.00 for CLFE. This event is volunteer driven by a group of individuals who work hard all year to ensure a successful fundraiser. We are truly grateful to these volunteers who worked so hard to make this the event of the Season!

In July 2017 we embarked on a journey of sharing the services of one Executive Director with Community Living Fort Erie. The Shared Services Oversite Committee is responsible for monitoring the arrangement to share Executive Director Services and to provide support and direction to the Executive Director. While this arrangement has been very successful to date, both Boards of Directors met in February and agreed to explore the idea of merging Community Living Fort Erie and Community Living Port Colborne - Wainfleet.

The Boards felt that a merged organization would build on the strengths of both. It would offer benefits to people supported, to their families and to staff. Benefits that would be achieved through efficiencies that come with having one organization rather than two. Initially the merged organization would focus on streamlining and increasing administrative capacity.

In June a Planning Survey was distributed to stakeholders, and, in July we will be holding eight stakeholder meetings. These will be opportunities to have input from everyone involved from both organizations about what should stay the same and what should change, if the merger proceeds.

Feedback from interested stakeholders through the survey and stakeholder meetings will be very important for the future of our organization. Input provided through the surveys and stakeholder meetings will be presented at the September Board meetings. If both boards recommend moving forward with an amalgamation, membership meetings will be held in October for final approval.

We wish to extend our sincere appreciation to the Board of Directors, volunteers, families and friends, and to our dedicated employees for their invaluable contributions throughout the year. Everyone plays an important role ensuring Community Living Fort Erie continues to provide quality services to our community. We look forward to another successful year in 2019 – 2020, inspiring possibilities in an inclusive community that only sees abilities.

Message from Board President and Executive Director

Over the summer, work continued on the exploration of a merger between Community Living Fort Erie and Community Living Port Colborne - Wainfleet. An important part of the process was consultation with the various stakeholder groups connected to both organizations, including people supported, families, unionized and non-unionized staff, management and Boards of Directors. This step acknowledged the importance of input from the people involved with the organization.

It was undertaken on the Boards' behalf by Tom Little and Nancy Collins of CMCS Consulting Services, using a survey and eight focus groups. The survey produced 169 responses and the focus groups engaged 91 participants. This large amount of input gave Tom and Nancy confidence in their findings.

Key Theme

The key theme that emerged from stakeholder input is that:

- CL Fort Erie and CL Port Colborne Wainfleet take very different approaches to service provision;
- People connected to each organization believe very strongly in their respective approaches; and
- These same people saw a merger as threatening those approaches; and
- For this reason, they were strongly opposed to a merger of the two.

Decision

All of this was communicated to the two Boards of Directors at a joint meeting held on Tuesday July 30th. After discussion and deliberation, the two Boards agreed to end the exploration of a merger with a decision not to merge at this time.

Challenges

With the decision made not to move forward with a merge, Community Living Fort Erie is still faced with the following challenges:

- Filling the Executive Director position;
- Resolving a number of financial pressures, including the cost of a full-time Executive Director, as already noted, as well as outstanding pay equity obligations, lack of administrative infrastructure (Finance, HR and IT), and possible funding cuts by the provincial government; and
- Overcoming the concerns raised to any kind of change, which CLFE stakeholders indicate exists in residential services, resulting from a reorganization in 2018.

It is the intention of the Board of Directors to seek input from management and staff in an attempt to overcome these challenges in a way that ensures our continued success as a community organization.

PRESS RELEASE Fort Erie Observer: Things are Shifting into Gear for Community Living Fort Erie with the arrival of a new Van

Fort Erie – On Tuesday, June 25th, over 60 people gathered at Community Living Fort Erie's AGM to celebrate and recognize what's been accomplished thanks to a \$38,500 Capital grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) earlier this year. Local MPP Wayne Gates attended the meeting and spoke about the impact the grant will have both today, and in the years to come.



"I want to say a very big thank you to the Community Living Fundraising Team for putting this successful proposal together," said Wayne Gates, MPP for Niagara Falls. "Their efforts mean that over 100 people will be able to participate in more active and healthy lifestyles. This is the kind of work that truly makes a difference in the lives of those in our community and I could not be prouder to support them in their mission."

The 10-person Community Living Fort Erie Fundraising Team used the OTF grant and raised an additional \$14,000 to buy the van they needed to help the people they support to increase opportunities to be engaged in community life. They now have a new, accessible van. This vehicle will provide enhanced service in addition to the Accessible Specialized Transit (FAST) that is currently available to people supported by Community Living Fort Erie. The van will provide barrier-free transportation to medical appointments, and community activities, including those happening in the evening and on weekends.

Transportation is one of the greatest barriers to inclusion. With this accessible vehicle people will have greater freedom and independence to be more active in their community," said Vickie Moreland, Executive Director, Community Living Fort Erie.

The Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) is an agency of the Government of Ontario, and one of Canada's leading granting foundations. Tony is an active member with Community Living Fort Erie's Advocates in Motion group where he meets with other like-minded individuals who advocate for inclusion within our community.


Tony is an extremely motivated and independent individual who should be recognized for breaking down barriers in our community through demonstrating all of his talents and gifts.
